

Nineteen Year Old Hazel Myers Was Murdered Is Verdict of Coroner's Jury

BLOW ON HEAD CAUSED DEATH OF GIRL FROM YORK SPRINGS

Discolored and Wounded, Decomposing Body Is Found by Farmer Saturday Afternoon

CONFLICTING CLUES CONFUSE THE AUTHORITIES

Evidences of a Struggle Found in Locust Grove and Belief Is That Living Body of Girl Was Thrown Into Cellar

Hazel Myers, 19 years old, daughter of Parker W. Myers, a prominent farmer residing in Latimer township, York county, near York Springs, was found dead late Saturday afternoon in the cellar of a deserted outbuilding on the farm of John F. Lahti, inmediately adjoining the borough of Latimer. Her wounds and the attendant circumstances point to murder.

From the condition in which it was found, the body had evidently been in this place for several days and mortification had set in. Summoned by telephone, Chief of Police William C. Conroy, immediately adjoining the borough of Latimer. Her wounds and the attendant circumstances point to murder.

Following the autopsy held yesterday afternoon an inquest was conducted this morning at 11 o'clock and a coroner's jury returned a verdict that "Hazel Myers came to her death from a blow on the head at the hands of a person or persons unknown."

Black and discolored with evidence slowly from her nose and ears the body of Hazel Myers, was on Saturday afternoon discovered by John F. Lahti in the cellar on the outbuilding at his farm, lying at the foot of the stairs where it is believed it had been carefully laid, her head pillowed on one arm, her dress pretty features discolored by her wounds and the mortification which had set in the preceased a horrifying sight.

Leaving her lying in the same position in which she was found, Mr. Lahti hastily telephoned to the chief of police who with other officials immediately proceeded to the scene of the investigation. The circumstances in the case all point to foul play and the coroner's jury at the inquest held later.

Found at Four O'clock The body was made shortly after four o'clock on Saturday afternoon. Mr. Lahti had just completed harvesting and had taken his horse to the old house which is used as an implement shed. It is just outside the town and is about a half mile from a short distance from the well known Locust Grove.

The cover of the outside cellar door which is to the east had a few feet from the gate that leads from the road were open and stopped to fasten the door.
