The members of the Court were then severally duly sworn by the Recorder, and the Recorder was duly sworn by the President of the Court, all of which oaths were administered in the presence of the accused.

The accused was thereupon arraigned and tried upon the following charges and specifications:

Constantly in town without permission. Associating with women of law and immoral character:

For a long time past practicing fonocation with one Mazel Myers a white girl of low character in the city of Carlisle.

Constantly disregarding school rules, and advise and counsel of the school authorities.

April S1,1914

Specification: In that the said John Bear did on the night of April 20th go to the home of Hazel Myers in company with her and another indian boy, for immoral purposes, and did remain the entire night occupying a bed with her, and having criminal intercourse with her.

> That upon being question by the disciplinarian he manifested a cross and mean manner, stating that he was a bad egg(meaning Bear) and that would stick to this girl and his relations with her, and no one could set-tit/tith/then separate them.

> Hazel Myers, the girl, testified that she has been run-ning with Bear for some time, and that it had been their custom to practice adultery many times; and that he had generally given her a dollar each time. She testifies that he paid her about 20 in all.

> That his conduct and general manner of living is a disgrace to the students of this school as well as the Institution itself.

"Hazel Myers testified that for a short time she and Bear did not run together on account of his going with a nay/gifi negro girl with whom she saw him on the street, and for whom he bought a new hat, but soon after this she made up with Bear.
