

2016 Dickinson College Farm Apprentice Application

The Dickinson College Farm Apprenticeship Program begins right after graduation and runs until mid-November, 2016. Apprentices can expect to engage in a 40 hour work week plus assist with evening and weekend chores, as needed. In return for their efforts, interns receive \$9 per hour plus additional benefits like free on-farm housing and Wi-Fi plus free access to farm-raised products such as vegetables, herbs, fruit, as well as discounted meat and eggs through the farm CSA.

The purpose of the apprenticeship is to equip you with the skills to advance toward future management of a diversified farm. Educational opportunities will be made available to supplement what you learn through daily farm work.
