***Baird, Spencer Fullerton**—Born February 3, 1823, Reading, Pa.; Samuel Baird; entered 1837; A. B., 1840; D. P., S., 1856; Ph. D., and LL. D.; studied medicine in New York city, 1840, professor of natural history, 1845-48, and of natural science, 1848-50, Dickinson college; assistant secretary Smithsonian institute, 1850-78; secretary Smithsonian institute, 1878-87; United States commissioner of fish and fisheries, 1871-87. Of the honorary recognitions of his services to science, the following are notable: 1875, the decoration of knight of the royal Norwegian order of St. Olaf, received from the King of Norway and Sweden; 1878, the silver medal awarded by the Acclimatization society of Melbourne; 1879, the gold medal of the Societe D'Acclimation de France; 1880, the Erster Ehrenpreis of the International Fischerei Ausstellung, at Berlin, the gift of the Emperor of Germany. He was a marvel of literary activity and productiveness. A bibliography of his works from 1843 to 1882 exhibits nearly 1200 titles. His first considerable work was the Ichnographic Encyclopeda translated from the German, begun in 1849. Others of his more important works are: "The Birds of North America," "Mammals of North America," "Review of American Birds in the Museum of the Smithsonian Institution," and "History of North American Birds," in conjunction with F. M. Brewer and R. Ridgeway, editor "Annual Reports of the Smithsonian Institution," 1852-87; U. P. society. Died at Woods Hall, Mass., August 19, 1887.

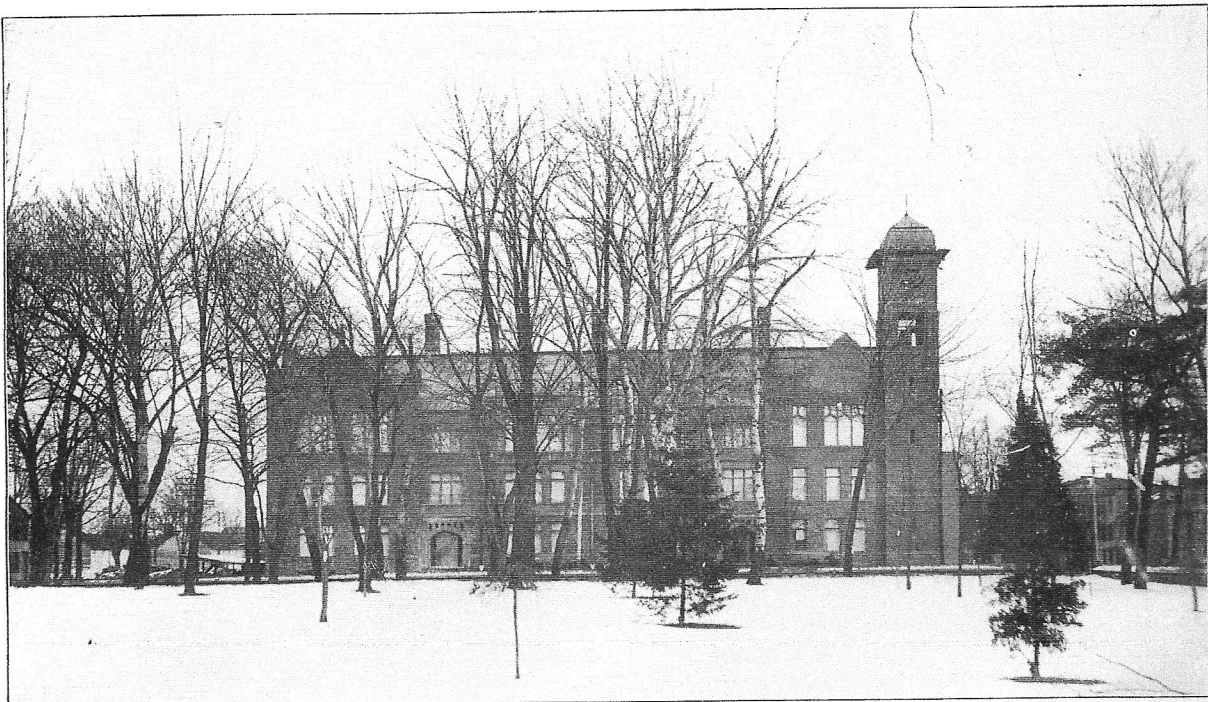
