The Fugitive Slave Case—Keenpe of Lewis—Great Excitement.

Lewis, the alleged fugitive, was brought before Commissioner Carpenter, yesterday at 21
o'clook, for final decision. Application was
made to continue the case, on the ground that
new testimory had been discovered of vital interest to the fugitive. This information came
by a telegraphic dispatch from Judge Spalding,
from Columbus. It was also desired to bring
the case before the Circuit Court, now sitting
at Columbus.

While Mr. Carpenter was giving his decision to allow this motion, the negro slipped away from Deputy U.S. Marshal Dryden, through the orowd unnoticed, and escaped. The fact becoming known created quite a sensation.—The Marshall started in pursuit—the crowded audience cheering as he left the court room. If he should be re-arrested further proceedings will be had in the case, Tucsday next. Up to a very late hour last night, no intelligence of the whereabouts of Lewis had been received. It is supposed that he has fled to Canada—Cincinnati Gasette, 20th.
