adelphia, on Tuesday afternoon, claimed as a fugitive slave, by Andrew Pierce, of Cecil county, Md. Testimony was produced to show that the alleged fugitive was the property of the claimant, and escaped from him six or seven years ago. The claimant is said to be the owner of several other slaves, and having no land of his own, hires them out to others by the year. Mr. Ingraham asked if any of the persons with whom the fugitive had been hired were present, and being answered in the negative, he said, " now that we have a secure place to keep fugitives from labor, he would postpone the further hearing until Friday, to give the claimant an opportunity to bring the persons on whom the slave had been hired, as the would rather have their testimony." The case was accordingly postponed until that day.

A colored man, named George Brodley, was brought before Commissioner Ingraham, in Phil-
