

HISTORY OF THE BLUEGRASS ON THE GRASS FESTIVAL

The roots of Dickinson's Bluegrass on the Grass Festival can be traced to bluegrass barn parties on the farm of Davis Tracy, who was the Director of the Dickinson College Counseling Center and an advisor to the college radio station WDCV. At one of these gatherings, bluegrass pioneers Hazel Dickens and Alice Gerrard played, and Tracy's Dickinson colleagues were so impressed that they encouraged him to organize a summer bluegrass concert on campus.

In July 1996, Davis and his band Country Bob and the Barbeque Boys, along with the Penn-Del Mountain Boys and the Fox Family, performed for a crowd of about 200. After this debut, the festival quickly grew in size and eventually moved to its present site in front of Bosler Hall and the historic Old West building. Today, the festival is a regional event drawing more than 4,000 music enthusiasts.

Bluegrass on the Grass is known for having a diverse mix of artists ranging from traditional bluegrass, olde time music, and "new" bluegrass. Since the initial festival, The Dismembered Tennesseans have been a regular staple of the festival. Bluegrass on the Grass has also showcased a number of major bluegrass acts over the years such as Lynn Morris, Blue Highway, Butch Baldassari & Mike Bubb, Dale Ann Bradley, The Claire Lynch Band, Junior Sisk & Ramblers Choice, Steep Canyon Rangers, Frank Solivan & Dirty Kitchen, Special Consensus, Michael Cleveland & Flamekeeper, The Boxcars, Hunger Mountain Boys, Chicken Chokers, Charm City Junction, Georgia Crackers, Mile Twelve, Nora Jane Struthers & the Party Line, and Russell Moore & IIIrd Tyme Out.

This non-profit festival is organized by volunteers. Dickinson College hosts the festival, contributes annual seed funding, and provides substantial logistical support for the event. Other contributions come from more than 200 private donors, program advertisements for Carlisle-area businesses, festival vendors, and Sponsor Ticket Sales on

the day of the event. These contributions, along with our volunteers, Make this celebration possible every year and allow organizers to pay the bluegrass musicians, provide them with first-class housing, and feed them during the festival.

Additional support comes from the record companies that represent the performers. These companies donate music CDs to be given away to festival attendees who purchase Sponsor Tickets. Record companies supporting the festival have included Billy Blue Records, Rebel Records, Rounder Records, Sugar Hill Records, Acoustic Disc Records, Pinecastle Records, Copper Creek Records, Mountain Roads Records, YepRoc Records, Patuxent Music, and Rural Rhythm Records.

The **Martin Guitar Company** of Nazareth, Pennsylvania has been a long-term partner of Bluegrass on the Grass by donating one of its guitars to a lucky Sponsor Ticket holder.

IN MEMORIAM FLETCHER BRIGHT



Fletcher Bright (1931–2017) was the most influential catalyst for Bluegrass on the Grass and the concert you are enjoying today. He was a beloved and well-known musician, teacher, and string band supporter.

As a musician, Fletcher had accomplished an amazing feat—keeping his high school bluegrass band together for 72 years! The Dismembered Tennesseans, formed when Bright was at the McCallie School in

Chattanooga. A natural and enthusiastic entertainer, Fletcher kept audiences all over the country in stitches whenever they performed.

Fletcher was a successful businessman who joined his father's real estate firm in 1953, and his son George now manages the company, which builds and maintains shopping centers throughout the southeastern U.S.

Fletcher generously shared his wealth with others who needed it. In the bluegrass and fiddle music world, organizers of festivals and camps always knew that he would pitch in to help when finances were stretched thin, and he was especially warm to young musicians trying to master their instruments. He never looked for credit for his generosity; he simply wanted the music and the learning to continue, and it has.

Fletcher set up a scholarship for Berklee College of Music students playing and studying roots music. According to Matt Glaser, the director of Berklee's American Roots program, Bright was one of America's best straight-ahead, old-school- style bluegrass fiddlers and a fine ragtime and stride pianist. In 2005, he received the Tennessee Governor's Award in the Arts in the Tennessee Folklife Heritage category.

Fletcher Bright was a friend to everyone in the bluegrass world, especially other fiddlers. He studied their music and often attended camps himself to learn at the feet of the best. In honor of Fletcher Bright's model of supporting young musicians, the Bluegrass on the Grass staff, continues, in a small way, his history as a musician, teacher and promoter of young, stringed instrument musicians by naming **Hannah Caswell** the winner of the 2025 Fletcher Bright Memorial Award.

Hannah Caswell is a rising 9th grader in Carroll County Public Schools. She is active in student government and sports, as well as being a talented visual artist and musician. She has taken violin lessons since the age of 4 and has performed regularly at local markets, festivals and private events with her father, Rob Caswell. The duo focuses on traditional bluegrass but can occasionally be found covering classic R&B, playing Scottish, Irish or French-Canadian fiddle tunes, or following their musical bliss

in other directions. A soulful singer and a talented player, Hannah delights audiences with her smile as well as her sound.



New Dismembered Tennesseans



Volumes could be written about the history of the **DISMEMBERED TENNESSEANS**, the bluegrass band formed by famed east Tennessee fiddler and philanthropist Fletcher Bright with his school friends at Chattanooga's McCallie High School in 1947. "Singing from the heart through the nose' is an apt description of our group," says Ed "Doc" Cullis, an original member who is still picking with the group today.

One of the most influential bluegrass bands in the region, the Dismembered Tennesseans played, sang, and laughed their way across the country for more than 70 years and through numerous personnel changes until Fletcher's passing on Christmas Day, 2017. To some, it seemed that the band had finally run its course, but fate had other plans.

In spring 2019, original member Doc Cullis (banjo) and long-time band alumni Laura Walker (bass and vocals) and Don Cassel (mandolin and vocals) formed the New Dismembered Tennesseans, welcoming three new members: Bobby Burns (guitar and vocals), Fletcher's granddaughter, Eleanor Bright (clawhammer banjo, guitar and vocals) and Tom Morley (fiddle and vocals).

Together, the new lineup has infused the band with new energy and a new sense of purpose, with a repertoire that both honors Fletcher and the original band and sends the music headlong into the future.

DANNY PAISLEY AND THE SOUTHERN GRASS continue to be deeply rooted in tradition but look to the future with enthusiasm and anticipation. The group's latest release, Bluegrass Troubadour, was nominated for IBMA's Album of the Year and earned significant chart action, with the song Blink of an Eye spending several months at the #1 spot on the Bluegrass music charts and was also nominated for IBMA Song of the Year.

Danny Paisley and the Southern Grass play powerful, unadorned, and intense traditional bluegrass. There is no hybrid or genre-bending music here. Their combination of instrumentation and vocals conveys the energy and emotion of classic bluegrass and country music. Danny's lead vocals will captivate your senses, so much so that many prominent musicians, including Alison Krauss, have considered Danny as one of their favorite singers. His voice combines powerful range and soulful blues with a sound like no one else in bluegrass today.

Danny Paisley and The Southern Grass continue to carry on a legacy set forth over six decades ago, gathering fans at each event; Danny Paisley and The Southern Grass look forward with renewed energy as they bring their unique sound to audiences near and far.
