FUGITIVE SLAVE CASE IN WEST CHESTER.—We see by the Register and Examiner that a fugitive slave case occurred there last Saturday morning. A young colored woman, named Elizabeth Williams, who had been convicted at last January court of the larceny of some money, and sentenced to five months' imprisonment in the county jail, was discharged on Saturday morning at 4 o'clock. She was immediately arrested at the prison door, by Milton Lapman, acting as Deputy U. S. Marshal, and taken before James L. Jones, Esq., U. S. Commissioner, charged with being a fugitive from labor, from New Castle county, in the State of Delaware. In an almost incredible short space of time, she was delivered to the claimant, or his agent, who put her into a close wagon and drove rapidly from the State.
