

ANOTHER FUGITIVE CASE.

On Wednesday the 1st inst., a young colored man, named Basil White, was brought before Ingraham by Alberti, as the slave of one Leonard Quinlan, of Baltimore county, Md., and doomed to a life of slavery in the most summary manner. Basil had come to this city last winter with the resolution to take care of himself, and ~~was~~ ~~well~~ ~~ed~~ well until he unfortunately fell in with one John Dorsey, also a colored man, who won his confidence by the warmest professions of friendship, and then betrayed him to Alberti. Basil was 'green,' inexperienced and unsuspecting, and easily victimized by these cunning villians. Dorsey took him to Alberti's house, Alberti professing the strongest interest in his welfare, and promising to get him a good situation. There he remained till his former master came and arrested him. Finding himself hopelessly entrapped, he confessed himself Quinlan's slave, and consented to return, thinking doubtless that this was his wisest policy. The whole case lasted but a few minutes, and was decided before the arrest was known far beyond the Commissioner's office, and yet the claimant managed to throw upon the U. S. Government the expense of transporting his captive to Maryland; by making oath that he feared an attempt to rescue him.
