Edward D. Ingraham a Commissioner under the Act of Congress of the 20th February, 1812, duly appointed by the Circuit Court of the United States, for the Eastern District of Pennsylvania, in the Third Circuit:—

To the Marshal and Deputy Marshals of the United States for the Eastern District of Pennsylvania, and to *John Connor* ————— by me appointed to execute warrants and other process, issued by me in the performance of my duties as Commissioner.

Whereas, It has been legally charged before me that *Stephen Bennett* a negro ————— being a person held to Service or Labour in the State of *Maryland* ————— and owing such Service or Labour to a certain *Edward B. Gallup of Baltimore in the State of Maryland* ————— hath escaped therefrom into the Eastern District of Pennsylvania: **Now**, In pursuance of the Acts of Congress of the United States, in this behalf made and provided, and by force of the authority vested in me as Commissioner, **I Do** by this warrant empower and command you, that you apprehend the said *Stephen Bennett* ————— if he be found within this District, and that you cause him to be brought forthwith before me.

Given under my hand and seal, at *Philadelphia* in the county of *Philadelphia* this *Twenty Second* day of *January* A. D. 1857.
